The Pyramid Healthcare Outpatient Program in Jacksonville, NC offers a full continuum of individualized, evidence-based outpatient treatment options specifically designed for adults struggling with substance use.

SACOT

Our Substance Abuse Comprehensive Outpatient Treatment (SACOT) is a program for individuals with a longer history of substance use who require greater support than a standard outpatient treatment program.

Our SACOT program meets five days per week and incorporates case management, individual, group and family therapy, mental health education and more.

SAIOP

Our Substance Abuse Intensive Outpatient Program (SAIOP) meets three days per week and provides customized, flexible support through group therapy, individual counseling, medication management and other proven treatments.

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ACTT Services

Pyramid Healthcare's Assertive Community Treatment Team (ACTT) works within the local community to provide services and support that meet the treatment, vocational, and housing needs of individuals.

ACTT is comprised of a comprehensive team of professionals from a wide variety of disciplines who provide treatment and guidance for symptom management, independent living, competitive employment, housing support, and recovery from substance use and mental illness.

Wraparound support is available to individuals with severe and persistent mental health or co-occurring issues with the highest risk of hospitalization, homelessness, or incarceration.

Who ACTT Helps

ACTT improves outcomes for individuals with severe mental illness who are most at risk of psychiatric crisis and/or affected by other social determinants of health, including those who:

- » Have visited a hospital for addiction or are at risk of hospitalization
- » Have been arrested due to their behavioral health issues or are at risk of incarceration
- » Are in financial difficulty
- » Are having trouble with medication
- » Have an existing medical condition that makes their addiction or behavioral health disorder worse
- » Have auditory or visual hallucinations
- » Do not have a support system of family members or friends
